Once you are hired as an entry-level direct support professional with OPWDD, you begin your career with an extensive New Employee Orientation. Learning is provided to you in the traditional classroom style, with interactive hands-on modules and on-the-job training days.

During this time, you will develop a comprehensive knowledge base for providing high-quality services to a diverse population of people.



Upon successful completion of the New Employee Orientation, you will be able to:

- Work towards becoming certified to administer medications.
- Support people through day-to-day activities and during difficult times.
- Provide first-aid and CPR.
- Assist people with the use of cutting-edge technologies and adaptive equipment.
- Be an integral part of a multi-disciplinary team.
- Assist people in developing skills and enjoying a more independent and self-directed life.
- Ensure people are provided a positive and therapeutic environment.
- Successfully complete a one-year traineeship program that provides you with additional supports.

Once you have completed your traineeship with OPWDD, you have multiple pathways to take for additional training and professional development.
