People with developmental disabilities want to be active participants in their community; they want and deserve opportunities to grow spiritually, enjoy community life, and have meaningful relationships.



Strategies for inclusion

Faith Based supports:

- To assist individuals with developmental disabilities who make faith choices to have their Individualized Service Plan (ISP) reflect their choices.
- To provide training and resource materials to state and voluntary agency employees that will help them create and sustain opportunities to support individuals with developmental disabilities who choose to belong to the faith community of their choice.
- To assist OPWDD regional offices to provide spiritual supports to individuals with developmental disabilities who do not reside in the community.
- To work with faith leaders and congregants to integrate individuals with developmental disabilities into the faith community as valued members.

Community relationships:

- To partner with houses of faith to create opportunities for community connections.
- To promote disability awareness forums in the community facilitated by advocacy groups.
- To partner with federal, state, and local agencies and organizations to promote community accessibility.

Who is served?

- Individuals with developmental disabilities who desire to grow spiritually and enjoy meaningful relationships in a faith community. Any individual who wants sustainable supports and regular opportunities to become a valued member of his/her community to be included in his/her ISP.
- Parents who want to find a faith community that will welcome them and their family member with a developmental disability.
- Faith community leaders who want to support individuals with developmental disabilities as valued members of their congregation.
- Provider agencies who want to engage faith communities to support individuals with developmental disabilities who seek to find spiritual well being in their community.
- Community based organizations who want their community to be reflective of and grow based upon the interests of all of its members.

How do I participate?

Individuals with developmental disabilities, families, and those who support them should contact their medicaid service coordinator or active treatment coordinator and discuss how to add faith inclusion to an ISP or a comprehensive functional assessment (CFA).

Provider agencies and faith community leaders interested in supporting individuals with developmental disabilities to become integrated in community life should contact their regional OPWDD office.
