Proclamation

Whereas, the Empire State recognizes direct support workers, direct care workers, personal assistants, personal attendants, in-home support workers, and paraprofessionals who are the primary providers of long term support and services for millions of individuals with disabilities; and

Whereas, through the course of a relationship built on trust and respect, direct support professionals assist individuals with disabilities with their personal needs on a daily basis; and

Whereas, direct support professionals provide a broad range of support, including the preparation of meals, helping with medications, bathing, dressing, mobility, transportation, and general daily affairs; and

Whereas, recognizing the importance of social interaction and community involvement, a direct support professional provides support to help keep individuals with disabilities connected to their families and communities; and

Whereas, key to allowing an individual with disabilities to live successfully as a part of his or her community, the work of direct support professionals also enables individuals and their families to avoid costly institutional care; and

Whereas, the majority of direct support professionals are employed in home- and community-based settings; and

Whereas, during this weeklong observance, all New Yorkers join to recognize the dedication and vital role of direct support professionals in enhancing the lives of individuals with disabilities of all ages, and extend appreciation for their contributions that help many overcome challenges and reach their full potential;

Now, Therefore, I, Andrew M. Cuomo, Governor of the State of New York, do hereby proclaim September 8-14, 2013 as
